




On a scale of 1 to 5, with 1 being completely unprepared and 5 being completely prepared, please rank where you feel you are regarding the start of school next week.






Students have not been in school so long and the social environment of our society has had an abundance of change and uncertainty that has undoubtfuly made students feel unsafe and unstable.


Student and staff health should be top priority followed by much smaller class sizes.

TEACHERS ONLY: Which of the following instruction-related suggestions would you support? (Check all that apply)






TEACHERS ONLY: Agree or Disagree with the following statement: I understand the process regarding how to track student attendance in my classes.








Would you be in favor of delaying the start of school until Labor Day, even if that means extending the school year into June?



Some responses to "What would you like to share with the superintendent . . ."

We have the opportunity to make online learning a wonderful experience for families thus having the future opportunity to reclaim students loss to charter schools. With the way this is shaping up, I believe we will see more loss of students because it is not possible to teach to a high standard both online and in person at the same time using the same staff. I am disappointed in FWCS lack of planning all case scenarios and leaving educators to flounder.

A lot of the first two days of tech training was not appropriate for special area teachers, when most/all have NEVER had the opportunity to fully integrate technology into instruction. It was so far past what we were comfortable with it induced panic in many special area teachers and apathy in others.

The district has done a great job in preparing for safety. I feel that it is a disservice to both in person and remote learners when the teacher is doing both jobs.

I understand why we want to be able to start the year off by getting to know our students in person, but I think that the constant guncertainty of when we might need to go completely virtual (either for only a couple of days while the school is cleaned, or as a district) is going to cause increased anxiety for everyone involved. I also think that the workload for teachers would be significantly more manageable if we were only needing to focus on teaching effectively through virtual learning.
